NOTES

1. Scottish Battalions will be allowed 1 Serjeant piper and 5 pipers in addition. At least 1 officer and 12 men (including all pioneers) will be trained in anti-gas and decontamination work.
2. Three men per company will be trained in stretcher bearer duties.
3. One man in each company will be trained to repair boots as a part time employment under the supervision of the shoemaker, R.A.O.C. and if qualified may be paid as a shoemaker (group C, class III) only on those days on which he is actually employed at that trade.
